Holy Mother Church today celebrates the Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost means fiftieth day. It was the second of three great Jewish feasts. For the Jews it was a day of gratitude. It was a day of thanksgiving for the completion of the harvest.

Pentecost day is called the "birthday" of the Church. When Jesus Christ first appeared to the disciples after his resurrection, all the apostles experienced the Holy Spirit in their lives (Jn 20:22). But on Pentecost day the descent of the Holy Spirit was a public manifestation intended to impress and amaze the crowds of local and foreign Jews who were gathered in Jerusalem for the festive occasion. So, on this day a great transformation took place in the small group of disciples, who locked themselves in fear of the Jews. Jesus after his resurrection asked his disciples not to leave Jerusalem till, they received the gift of the Holy Spirit from His Father. All the readings today, speak about the arrival of the Holy Spirit, which will help us to bear witness to God's word and lead others towards God.

From this day forward they were men dedicated to one purpose and to one purpose only, to bring the good news, the Gospel of Christ, to the world. The Acts of the Apostles also gives us a great account of the heroic ways through which they witnessed to the message of the gospel. They were once timid, but after the experience of the Holy Spirit, they were all totally different persons in their lives.

We all have received the Holy Spirit when we were confirmed. The Holy Spirit is a wonderful friend in our lives. When we are discouraged or saddened by the daily burden of our lives, we go and tell our friends our stories and when they listen to us, we feel half of our problem is solved. I have this experience in my life, when I find it difficult to make some decisions and to find out whether the decision, I made was right. I always seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit. I am sure as you journey in life you will find for yourself how life becomes difficult, but if you take a step towards this beautiful friend, you will find help. So always seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit in our lives and always lead a life that is pleasing to God.

Saint for the Week: St Rita of Cascia

Born in 1381, St Rita was united in marriage to a difficult man whom she suffered with patience. When her husband was murdered, her two sons vowed vengeance. St Rita prayed that God would preserve them from sin, and both men died of natural causes before they could commit a crime. Afterwards St Rita entered the Augustinian convent in Cascia, Italy. Her desire for a share in Christ's Passion was answered when she received the wound of a thorn driven into her forehead. The suffering and isolation that the wound engendered were borne by St Rita until the time of her death in 1457. Her special patronage is the impossible case.

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: Acts: 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading: Galatians 5:16-25

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things.

I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desire. Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.
